

WILLIAM EDWARDS SCHOOL Year 11 Mock Interview Day



Friday 20th October 2023 staged the Twentieth Mock Interview Day held at William Edwards School. This event has traditionally marked a significant point in the school's Careers Education and Information, Advice and Guidance programme as the Year 11 pupils prepare themselves for post 16 transition.

In preparation for this role-play activity the pupils had to prepare a CV and draft a personal profile statement, as well as to practice their interview skills. For this activity the students had to believe that this

was the real deal and the year group were commended by all of the 45 external interviewers for buying into the event and conducting themselves in a professional manner.

The day entailed the Year 11 wearing professional dress and participating in a series of one-to-one job interviews lasting up to 20 minutes. The interviewers received the CV's and personal statements at their working breakfast where they planned their questions for the eight pupils they would interview during the day. After each interview the interviewers





offered advice and guidance on how to

improve and develop and offered further information about the job and apprenticeship specific applications made by the pupils. They also completed an evaluation which is shared with the student as a written record of their performance. The evaluations are also used by Mrs Doyle to help her to plan for the subsequent Careers interviews when supporting them individually with their post 16 education and apprenticeship applications.

The day was a hugely successful experiential learning opportunity for our students and was only possible because forty-five interviewers gave up their time to spend the day with us. Our thanks specifically go out to the following people:
